FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Today is sometimes called "Good Shepherd Sunday". Jesus is called the "gate" of the sheep in today's gospel. The risen Christ opens the way to abundant life. He anoints our heads with oil and guides us beside the still waters of our baptism. Each Sunday he spreads a feast before us beside the still waters of our baptism. Each Sunday he spreads a feast before us amid the world's violence and war. We go forth to be signs of the resurrection and extend God's tender care to all creation.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia. Jesus says, I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me. *Alleluia.* (John 10:14)

Gathering Hymn - My Shepherd, You Supply My Need My Shepherd, you supply my need; most holy is your name. In pastures fresh you make me feed, beside the living stream. You bring my wandering spirit back when I forsake your ways, and lead me, for your mercy's sake, in paths of truth and grace.

When I walk through the shades of death, your presence is my stay; one word of your supporting breath dries all my fears away. Your hand, in sight of all my foes, does still my table spread; my cup with blessings over flows, your oil anoints my head.

The sure provisions of my God attend me all my days; oh, may your house be my abode and all my work be praise. Here would I find a settled rest, while others go and come; no more a stranger or a guest, but like a child at home.

Prayer of the Day

O God our shepherd, you know your sheep by name and lead us to safety through the valleys of death. Guide us by your voice, that we may walk in certainty and security to the joyous feast prepared in your house, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Readings and Psalm

Acts 2:42-47 (*Please use this as an opportunity to read from your bible*). Today's reading is a description of life in the community following Peter's sermon on the day of Pentecost, when the Spirit was poured out on God's people. The new community is sustained in worship and fellowship, shares what they have, and ensures that everyone has enough.

Psalm 23 (This is one of the most beautiful and well known psalms in the Bible and it would be a shame to miss highlighting this psalm and giving it some well deserved attention in light of today's message. Thanks to Connie Landstrom for this special reflection. I have taken the liberty to incorporate some her comments here. Thank you Connie.)

"I wonder how many times you've said or heard the words of Psalm 23...

- of all the psalms it's probably the best known and many people's favourite ...maybe yours too!
- the words are familiar and beloved...I suspect most of you know the words, and some of you have even memorized them
- we have learned that those words comfort us in times of uncertainty and sustain us through sorrows and losses...
- they give us courage when we are afraid...they assure us there is nothing to fear in the dark valley of death...
- -they offer hope and strength to take our next step...
- -they remind us there is a way forward when we feel powerless and fearful...
- -they promise us that we never walk alone...

How fortunate are we that Psalm 23 is the Psalm appointed for today!...

- -these words are exactly what we need to hear today in the midst of COVID-19...
- -I want to give these words to the grieving in Nova Scotia, to those who have lost loved ones to the virus...to all who are filled with sorrow, confusion, loss and grief

When I look at all that has changed about our life and world...

- -when I acknowledge the uncertainties of our future...
- -when I read the statistics of cases and deaths...
- -when I think about those who are losing jobs or income...
- -when I wonder how long it will be before we again greet each other with hugs, kisses, and handshakes...
- -I don't want more information or answers about COVID-19...I don't want more instructions on what to do or not do...I want to hear words of hope...
- I want to be reminded that "the Lord is my shepherd" and "I shall not be in want."
- -I want to be reassured that all shall be well...
- -I want to soak myself in the words of Psalm 23 and let them soak into me...
- -and I am thinking you want the same things I do

So today I want to suggest you do something now as your worship...

- -could you let this be your new prayer practice for this week...or even longer!
- take Psalm 23... and pray it when you get up in the morning...
- -pray it again at noon...pray it again before you fall asleep...
- -pray it for yourselves, for each other, Nova Scotia, for Canada, for your family, neighbours, and for the world
- -pray it slowly and pray it deeply...enjoy some silence between verses...kind of a soaking space between each verse
- -consider praying each verse slowly and prayerfully...

How fortunate are we that Psalm 23 is the psalm appointed for today?

- isn't it exactly what we need to hear today...and tomorrow, and the next day...and the days and days after that!"

1 Peter 2:19-25 (Please use this as an opportunity to read from your bible). Doing the right things does not guarantee that one will not experience difficulties, hardships, rejection, or even suffering. Here Christ is presented as the model for our path of endurance and loyalty to God, particularly amid adversity.

Gospel Reading

Glory to you, Oh Lord

John 10:1-10

"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gate keeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

With bold confidence in your love, almighty God, we place all for whom we pray into your eternal care; through Christ our Lord. (Please take time to pray here for any family members or friends who need special remembering at this time. Amen.
